The study when completed has potential to inform policy in terms of curricular re-engineering, approach to teaching and research, guidance and mentoring of postgraduate students in these institutions, and most importantly the much needed university-graduate-industrial interface which is germane for industrial and technological growth and development in a growing economy like Nigeria.


